Preparing for Our Inaugural Class of Students Phoenix RISE at Fred K. Marchman Technical College Todd Bryers, Program Coordinator



The staff at Fred K. Marchman Technical College (FKMTC) has been hard at work preparing for the launch of the inaugural class of the Phoenix RISE Program (RISE). The year has been full of exciting milestones: the team visited three established technical colleges to learn best practices, ordered furniture and supplies, designed their logo, received their first set of program shirts, established an Occupational Advisory Committee comprised of local business and community leaders, and conducted other activities including outreach and networking in the community.

One of the proudest accomplishments at Phoenix RISE is the creation of the Policies and Procedures Manual. This was a critical document for the program —this manual laid the foundation that allowed the program to officially accept five students. Thanks to the dedication of the team, they successfully developed the application, interview, and acceptance processes. Creating this manual was a goal we set at the 2024 Florida Postsecondary Education Program Planning Institute (FLPEPPI), and I'm proud to say we've met that goal. We're looking forward to further developing and improving our program in the coming years.

With our framework in place, we actively promoted RISE across the county—participating in transition nights, meeting with Pasco County Schools district staff, and hosting three group campus tours. After opening our application process, we conducted interviews and officially accepted five students into our first RISE cohort!

Our entire community is excited as we continue preparing to welcome these students into the FKMTC family. We look forward to supporting them as they develop vital employability and life skills that will open doors to meaningful careers within our local workforce. Each student brings their own unique strengths, and our team is looking forward to assisting them in growing and thriving as they build on their skills and talents. This is an incredible opportunity for everyone involved, and I am truly grateful to be a part of it.
